Ecumenical Catholic Diocese of New England Process for Receiving a Person Ordained in the Catholic Tradition

- The ordained person applying to be received into ECDNE (applicant) must be ordained by a
 bishop ordained in the line of Apostolic Succession; if this is not the case, or if the person is
 unsure if such is the case, then that person must be ordained sub conditione by the bishop
 of ECDNE as a condition for being formally received
- 2. The applicant shall provide:
 - A letter of request to be formally received into the Ecumenical Catholic Diocese of New England and to be granted sacramental faculties
 - A CV or through resume
 - A brief auto biography that explains what brought the applicant to this point
 - Proof of educational background
 - Proof of ordination
 - Three letters of reference from ministries in which the applicant has been involved
 - A recently completed CORI check
- 3. The applicant must be interviewed by at least two members of the Board of Directors; upon recommendation by those two Board members the applicant is to be invited to meet the whole board at its next meeting
- 4. If both the Board of Directors and the applicant wish to move forward, then a vote must be taken by the Board to formally receive the applicant as an ordained member of ECDNE
- 5. The process comes to completion at a ceremony presided over by the bishop, during which the applicant signs a document stating:
 - That the applicant agrees to abide by the by-laws and code of ethics of the Ecumenical Catholic Diocese of New England
 - That the applicant understands that infraction of the bylaws or code of ethics will result in a Board vote to terminate membership

The Bishop of ECDNE signs the document accepting the applicant as a priest in good standing in ECDNE, concluding the process.

[For applicants ordained in a tradition other than Catholic - such applicants will be considered on a case by case basis.]
